

# How Investor in Careers works

We have developed our approach to support a range of educational providers towards achieving and maintaining the Quality in Careers Standard:

Primary, secondary, independent, special schools and pupil referral units Training providers, Sixth Form and Further Education Colleges.

We also work with Multi Academy Trusts, Councils, Boroughs and groups of schools. The benefits of this approach are cost reductions and shared learning and support. Please get in touch.

Common to all education providers seeking to achieve the Standard is:

- Self-assessment leading to the development of an action plan to meet the Quality Standard
- Submission of evidence to meet the outcome indicators
- External assessment by qualified and occupationally competent assessors which includes discussions with staff, governors, partners and students.

In order to ensure that The Quality in Careers Standard is challenging, but at the same time manageable, it is organised into sections for Commitment, Organisation, Delivery and Evaluation which meet The Quality in Careers Standard requirements.

### The costs are: \*

Quality in Careers Standard – £1200 Primary School Award – £850 Re-assessment – £750

\*All costs are plus VAT

The time to complete will vary depending on your starting point and how much you already have in place. Providers can complete within 6 months but an academic year to 18 months is a realistic target. The award is valid for 3 years and is renewed after successful re-assessment.

### The Quality in Career Standard cost includes:

- An online portfolio which enables you to upload all your evidence, access resources, allows CSW to check evidence prior to assessment ensuring you are on track
- Stage assessment costs.
- Assessment visit to the learning provider by registered assessor
- On-going telephone/email support
- Digital handbook and resources to support your work towards meeting the Standard.
- Digital certificates for each stage completion
- Plague upon completion of the award.
- Social media promotion and celebration on completion of the award
- Case study promotion upon completion
- Use of IiC and the Quality in Careers logos during the process

## Commitment

Learning Provider demonstrates commitment to careers education, information, advice and guidance (CEIAG) and The Quality in Careers Standard.

This forms the initial part of an engagement process to raise awareness and communication with all stakeholders.

Self-assessment by Learning Provider resulting in an action plan to meet the Quality in Careers Standard.

Assessment and formal recognition of Commitment by Investor in Careers.

# Organisation

Ensuring that the governing body provides clear strategic advice so that the learning provider's senior leadership team have a clear and effective strategy for developing and implementing the careers programme (taking full account of current statutory duties).

Securing effective day-to-day leadership, management, and delivery of the careers programme by all relevant staff.

Promoting awareness and understanding of the careers programme.

A written and published policy for CEIAG.

### Delivery

A programme of Careers Education is delivered that addresses the career learning needs of each student.

- have a planned, organised and differentiated programme of CEIAG to meet individual student learning needs (Gatsby Benchmark 1)
- enable learning from career and labour market information (Gatsby Benchmark 2)
- address the needs of each student (Gatsby Benchmark 3)
- link curriculum learning to careers (Gatsby Benchmark 4)
- provide encounters with employers and employees (Gatsby Benchmark 5)
- provide experiences of workplaces (Gatsby Benchmark 6)
- provide encounters with Further and Higher Education providers (Gatsby Benchmark 7)
- provide Personal Guidance (Gatsby Benchmark 8).



### Evaluation

Ensuring that all staff involved in the careers programme – preparing all students for choices, decisions, and transitions – are knowledgeable, skilled, and confident in their CEIAG roles.

The CEIAG programme is systematically monitored, reviewed and evaluated to ensure that CEIAG delivered is effective in meeting the needs of all students.
